Term 3 "Love Makes a House a Home."

PSHE

We will be exploring more about ourselves and the world we live In. This includes different types of families and homes, belonging to a community and respecting our differences.



QUEST

We will be exploring the local area to see what activities are available and improving students' confidence in accessing facilities. We will be attending swimming sessions at Horsham leisure centre to improve their confidence in the water and develop social skills at the same time.



<u>Literacy</u>

Our main class text, around which the majority of this term's work will be based, is 'What We'll Build' by Oliver Jeffers. This will provide prompts for a range of activities and learning opportunities. We will also be reading other books by Oliver Jeffers as part of our daily reading. In Phonics, we will be focusing on developing blending and segmenting skills within Level 2. You should have received a letter about Rhino Readers - it would be great for students to regularly access these books at home with you.

Cooking We will be focusing on

'lunches' this half term, making pasta dishes, hot and cold sandwiches including wraps, and filled pasties.



Art

🖻 🔤 In Art this term, students will be exploring abstract art through looking at, replicating and then synthesising the work of abstract artists such as Hilma af Klint and Wassily Kandinsky. Students will use mono-printing, oil pastels and collage to produce a final piece by the end of the term.

Science

We will begin to explore properties of materials, linked to 'The Three Little Pigs' - what is a good material to make a building out of? We will then develop scientific thinking through investigating permeability what's the best material to use for a roof to keep the rain out?

2+3=5

Numeracy

We will be continuing to work on numbers within 20, developing counting skills from any given number both forwards and backwards and using equipment to support with simple addition and subtraction problems. We will also be looking at 2D shapes, naming them and recognising them in different orientations as well as putting shapes together to create different pictures!

Computing

We will be using iPads this half term to develop some basic coding skills using 'Scratch Jr'. Students will use dragging and dropping to programme characters on the screen, building on the work they've done with BeeBots in the first half term to recognise the cause and effect of different 'blocks'.
